### COMMUNITY AND CAMPUS SERVICE GUIDELINES

#### Community and/or campus service is defined as voluntary work performed for the benefit of the local community.

There are two honors that students can receive for completing hours of service to the campus and the community. They can earn a gold cord to wear at graduation for completing 100+ hours of service to their campus and/or community. They can also be considered for a Vanguard district award for completing 300+ hours of community service only.

CAMPUS SERVICE HOURS: These hours DO NOT count towards Vanguard, but DO count towards a graduation cord.

#### After School Activities/Meetings:

Time outside of a student's school schedule to tutor fellow students, to assist a teacher (beyond the teacher's work responsibilities), or to volunteer personal time for an organized and pre-approved school ARE approved for campus/community service hours. If in doubt, please ask before the activity regarding approval.

Campus and/or community service hours will NOT be awarded for projects assigned for academic credit or for campus fundraising. If a student volunteers his or her time for a specific class in his or her schedule, it is not considered valid community service hours. For example:

- Athletic trainers attending football games
- Choir members signing with the school choir for any function
- Volunteer musicians playing for the school musicals
- Students videoing plays and other events for MaVision
- Students attending after-school meetings for organizations of which they are members
- Students helping teachers grade papers or any other activity within the teacher's job responsibilities
- Students raising money or selling items/tickets for any school organization or for a graduating class, including Project Graduation or prom

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS**: These hours **DO** count towards Vanguard **AND** towards a graduation cord.

Good examples of community service are: Helping out at a soup kitchen or homeless shelter, volunteering your time to help out in a retirement or nursing home, building houses for Habitat for Humanity, volunteering at the local Salvation Army or animal shelter or for an animal rescue group, etc.

#### Fundraising:

Fundraising<sup>\*</sup> projects by non-profit organizations such as the Lion's Club Walk for Sight, Relay for Life Aids Walk, Breast Cancer Awareness, Drunk Driving Awareness, etc. DO count toward community service hours.

#### Church/Religious Groups:

Being active in a church by playing an instrument in the church band or being an altar boy/girl every Sunday is not considered community service. Mission trips are not community service unless community service was the objective of the mission. For example, a mission trip put together to help build houses for a less fortunate neighborhood or family would be considered valid community service. Helping sort donated clothes at church to be contributed to a charity later or working a church carnival or bazaar are considered community service.

Volunteer chores or helping family members in a business or office will not be considered as community service hours.

## WHEN IN DOUBT, PLEASE ASK YOUR GRADE LEVEL CAMPUS ADMINISTRATOR

\*Fundraiser organizations must qualify as a charitable organization under tax exempt guidelines. If a contribution to the organization is tax deductible, then time spent on behalf of the organization will be accepted.
